PATS CARPOOLING INITIATIVE


USF Parking and Transportation Services seeks to improve the parking experience for students, staff, and faculty and sees encouraging people to carpool to campus as a way to decrease the number of cars and potentially increase parking availability.

Intending to provide an incentive for people to carpool to campus, PATS has teamed up with the Center for Urban Transportation Research to test RideFlag, a mobile application that can determine the number of occupants in a car and deliver digital rewards to commuters who carpool to campus.

Once this program is up and running, the plan is for each parking lot to have spaces reserved for people who carpool. If somebody drives to campus with at least one more person in their car, they can use the app to verify it and park at the nearest preferred carpooling parking spot.

The main challenge is to determine the accuracy of the RideFlag app and whether this would be an effective motivation for people to carpool to campus. PATS and CUTR are working with the Student Government to gather volunteers to test the app, but they would appreciate it if USF employees took part in testing the app as well. By testing the accuracy and reliability of the RideFlag app with volunteer carpool testers, PATS is one step closer to improving the parking experience on the Tampa campus. The testing phase is active now and, if successful, the initiative will be implemented by next Fall.
