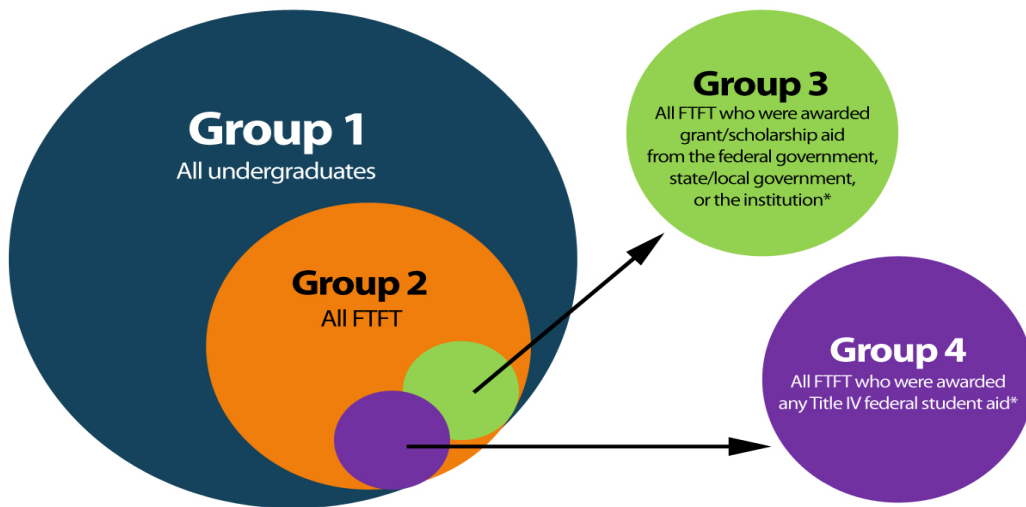

COA Revisions

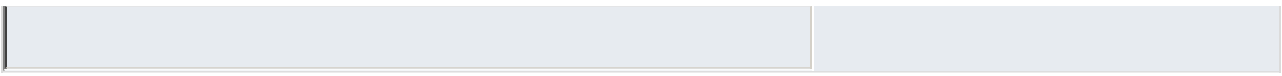
